Islington envisage working with <u>IMECE</u>, the Turkish Speaking Women's Group and the <u>Domestic Violence Intervention Project</u> (DVIP), in order to develop communitybased initiatives to address violence amongst young people involved in, or at risk of becoming involved in, gang violence and/or violence against women.

DVIP will deliver perpetrator work to young men identified by the Health or Youth Offending departments of LB Islington, or by the wider partnership, as perpetrators of domestic violence.

In addition, DVIP will provide one-to-one support to the partners of the young men, focusing on issues of safety and the dynamics of partner violence, including the gang context.

IMECE will provide support to young women from black and ethnic minority backgrounds. Both organisations will be involved in community workshops aimed at young people. These workshops will engage young people in creating RAP music with an anti-violence message. This will serve to promote awareness of gender-based violence amongst those at risk of becoming involved in gang or partner violence.
