Not only in terms of its protection and preservation but, since a couple of years, also as a significant economic factor. It is widely acknowledged that a <i>green economy</i> – the interplay between economy, environment and social matters – constitutes a recent trend towards a sustainable development of society. How does the transition of society and economy proceed? What efforts are made by governments, organizations and the economic sector? What are the consequences and implications of striking this new path? What is the role of each individual in this process?</p> <p>During a five-day seminar in Brussels the <i>International Network for European Studies e.V. (INES)</i> would like to find answers to these and other interesting questions while focusing mainly on Europe and its implementation of a green economy. In particular, we would like to focus on the socio-economic aspects of Green Economy.
