

## **SUPPORTIVE IPR FRAMEWORK FOR SMES AND START-UPS**

**Intellectual property rights (IPR)** protect companies' intangible assets and allow them to profit from their creations and innovations. Today, only a small number of SMEs and Start-ups use IPRs, either because they lack the necessary knowledge and expertise, or they find procedures to protect their IPRs too costly. Helping small companies wishing to access and make use of the IP system can lead to **higher returns from their innovation efforts** and give them **easier access to finance**. That's why the Commission is putting forward a **package of actions to support startups and SMEs** with their intellectual property, especially when growing within the Single Market.

## WHAT SOLUTIONS IS THE COMMISSION PROPOSING?

The Commission puts forward a **package of actions** to help SMEs/start-ups access use and manage IP rights, and help improve the overall performance of existing IP support measures:

- developing a tailored service matching the individual business needs of SMEs.
- working with Member States to improve IP awareness actions and IP funding for SMEs.
- co-financing through COSME the access of SMEs to European patents (including future unitary patents).
- developing patent licensing information.
- developing an EU IP mediation and arbitration network for SMEs/start-ups to solve disputes without the need to go to court.
- encouraging the creation of European-level insurance schemes for litigation so that SMEs/start-ups have the capability of defending, when necessary, theirs rights in court.

 encouraging the adoption of a common method for determining the financial value of IP assets to facilitate banks to better understand the value of these start-ups.



## WHAT SUPPORT IS ALREADY AVAILABLE?



The European IPR Helpdesk offers free of charge, first-line support on IP and IPR matters to beneficiaries of EU funded research projects and EU SMEs involved in transnational partnership agreements.

Three specialised helpdesks support European SMEs in China, South-East Asia and Latin America.

These multilingual helpdesks offer **free services** including confidential first-line advice on registering formal IPRs (such as patents, trademarks or design rights), managing intellectual property as a business asset, dealing with intellectual property rights infringements, and the provision of information and training on related topics.
